Christ Our Savior Priest – Prophet - King

He is, "the Way (King), the Truth, (Prophet) and the Life (Priest). Jn. 14:6

Jesus' work on earth was centered on His obedience to the Father epitomized and completed with His death on the cross. He made visible the Word of God in His life "mission". He taught by His words and deeds the message of God. He showed us the way to the Father in His life as He came to serve and not to be served. His mission was that of Priest, Prophet, and King.

Christ Our Savior's Ministry: Priest – Prophet – King

- He founded the Church, His Body, to embody and carry on the work of Priest, Prophet, and King in all ages and thus bring people to salvation.
- The Church is a community of disciples of Jesus called to live in a state of friendship with Him and give witness to His love in the world. They are the light of the world.
- The Church is sent as Jesus was sent. Therefore the heart of the Church is mission. The Church is always fulfilling the great command – Go-teach-baptize. (Matt. 28:21)
- The Church of Christ is an ordered community of the faithful.

What is a Parish?

- A parish is a certain community of the Christian faithful stably constituted in a particular church (diocese), whose pastoral care is entrusted to a pastor as its proper pastor under the authority of the diocesan bishop.
- It is in this community that most followers of Jesus live their Christian lives, and with the grace of God, strive for salvation becoming configured to Christ.
- A parish embodies and makes present the threefold ministries of Jesus as Priest, Prophet, and King, that is, they worship the Father, evangelize and catechize and serve one another in the community and reach out to the world.

Parish Ministry

- So our command from Jesus as a parish is to worship, evangelize and catechize, and serve.
- An essential component to all of this is the need to be stewards of all that God has given us. In doing that the parish will have the means to fulfill its function.
- A particular effort needs to be made to increase our Sunday offerings by helping everyone realize that following Jesus means having a generous spirit. "It is in giving that we receive." We give not to receive, we give because we have been given.

Divine Mercy Area Faith Community

- Due to the changing demographics in rural Minnesota and the declining of Priests, our bishops, beginning with Bishop Lucker, followed by Archbishop Niensted, and now continuing with Bishop LeVoir have undertaken studies and established pastoral plans for the diocese to fulfill its mission.
- Archbishop Niensted established Area Faith
 Communities, that is, parishes working together to
 advance the cause of Christ by sharing their strengths.
 As you know, ours consist of the four parishes of St.
 Mary's, St. Michaels, Japanese Martyrs, and St. Paul's,
 and the Oratory of St. Joseph in Clements.

Major Challenges

- One of the major challenges facing our AFC is helping people to know the love of Jesus and seeing faith as an important part in their lives. We need to maximize our efforts to evangelize.
- We must remember we are a missionary Church. We are continually on mission. Our mission is our kitchen table, our workplace, our neighborhood, etc.






Investment Valuation Trend







Diocesan Bankruptcy

- On March 3, 2017, the corporation of the Diocese of New Ulm filed for financial reorganization under Chapter 11 of the U.S. Bankruptcy Code.
- Chapter 11 provides a neutral, court-supervised process for the Diocese of New Ulm to establish a plan to pay its creditors while continuing work essential to its mission.
- The Diocese and those representing victims and survivors will continue to work together, under the guidance of the court, to come to a fair resolution of claims. It is unknown how long this will take, but we seek to complete the reorganization process as promptly and efficiently as possible.
- Parishes, Catholic schools, and other Catholic organizations located in the geographic area served by the Diocese are not part of this filing. Parishes and other Catholic organizations are separate corporations under Minnesota law.
