One homeless New York City newsboy Jack Kelly (Joseph Goedtke, son of David and Kathleen) befriends two newcomers to his trade, Davey (Kyle McKeown, son of Mike and Gina) and Les (Addie Hoffmann, daughter of



Andy ('96) and Heather (Heiderscheidt '96)), who also dreams of a better life far from the hardship of the streets. However, when publisher Joseph Pulitzer (Jacob Lux, son of Matt ('88) and Maria) raises distribution prices -

at the newsies' expense, making it harder for the young newspaper salesmen to make a buck, the boys go on strike and Jack finds a cause for which to fight. With the help of the beautiful female reporter, Katherine Plumber (Gabby Helget, daughter of Bill ('93) and Jenny (Braulick '94)), all of New York City soon recognizes the power of the "little man."



Newsies is based on the true story of the 1899 newsboys' strike.


MISS SLEEPY EYE 2019

YES! TEAM AWARDED 1ST PLACE!

Congratulations to the Sleepy Eve YES! Team on receiving the 2019 Regional 1st Place Award of \$500.00. The panel of judges felt that the team showed "deep understanding of criteria, used strategic action, and proved excellent success." In addition, the judges commented on effective teamwork, strong community ing water quality.

the Social Justice Theme Care for God's Creation which urges us to "re-engage with our environment and take responsibility for it; live sustainably, live so that there are enough resources for everyone" (US-CCB). Since joining the program in 2011, Sleepy Eye's YES! Team is offered as a joint extracurricular between St. Mary's Catholic and Sleepy Eye Public schools and has proven to be a productive eight year partnership.

Major community projects seem to choose the YES! Team rather than the other way around. For instance, one of the first projects came about when the public utilities director asked the team to replace incandescent light bulbs with more energy efficient lighting in three apartment complexes in Sleepy Eye. Soon afterwards, CERTs (Clean Energy Resource Teams) invited the YES! Team to enter B3 benchmarking data in the State of MN database. Next, an organization called Friends of the MN Valley recruited Sleepy Eye to collect water quality data on two Minnesota River tributaries for the MN Pollution Control Agency. More locally, Bob Rubey approached YES! with the idea of using the rough areas around Sleepy Eye golf course to attract monarch butterflies. The seed of that idea sprouted into partnership with the MN DNR and a native pollinator enthusiast and grew into a one acre prairie restoration project at the golf course. At about the same time, the manager of Ross Park Apartments requested that YES! Team plant a butterfly garden on the grounds for residents to enjoy. Most recently, the DNR regional wildlife manager asked if the team would be interested in helping with a much larger prairie restoration project on an 80 acre tract of land south

of Sleepy Eye. These projects engage the students in a broad spectrum of efforts to solve ecological challenges.

The most basic ecological challenge, however, is to embed within people a lifestyle of stewardship. Many environmental problems would clear themselves or would not even exist if humans used resources wisely. Therefore, many hands-on YES! projects within the schools reinforce the adage: Reduce, Reuse, Recvcle. For instance, teachers are encouraged to reuse one-sided worksheets and print on the back sides as well, each room and the end of hallways have recycle bins, fluorescent lights are replaced with LEDs, useable school supplies from locker clean-out at the end of the year are packed up and donated to various organizations, and hydration stations promote reusing a single water bottle rather than multiple plastic bottles. Hopefully, these stewardship practices become lifelong habits.

In Sleepy Eye, Mrs. Deb Reinarts, science teacher at SEPS, and Mrs. Mary Beth Botz, science teacher at SMS, are co-advisors for the YES! Team. Statewide, YES! is a program of Prairie Woods Environmental Learning Center in partnership with Laurentian Environmental Center and Ney Nature Center. Major funding for the 2018-19 season is provided by the MN Environment and Natural Resources Trust Fund.

'Originally, YES! stood for Youth Energy Summit, which limited the vision to energy projects. The new name and logo were adopted in 2018.


