On Friday, May 19, twenty-two kindergartners participated in their "Kindergarten Graduation." These students will be, God willing, the St. Mary's High School Class of 2035! It is a fun event each year. After a school Mass, the children sing a song for their parents and grandparents before having their

name called to receive their "diploma" and shake the hand of the principal and myself. Then they go on to get a little blue mortar board and have their picture taken as a group before processing out to the hymn "Pomp and Circumstance" that we hear each year at graduations. At high school graduation receptions, it is a common thing to see these kindergarten mortar boards as part of the display put together honoring the accomplishments of the student who has spent 13 years at St. Mary's School.

As we leave another academic year behind us, I am struck by the accomplishments and talents of our students. We had successful seasons in our sports teams as well as the fine arts with a musical, and our music and band programs. (As of writing this, both the baseball and softball teams are at the top of the Tomahawk Conference!)

This year I taught 9th and 10th grade religion/theology classes in the high school, and that same "creativity" shows itself in all sorts of interesting ways. What I frequently tell people is that St. Mary's School is truly what a parochial school should be accessible to all who want a Catholic education and affordable. It is unfortunate that in many places, especially for Catholic high schools, they are often more "prep schools" and that their high tuition makes them inaccessible to the majority of people. We are fortunate to have the support of our parish, parents and alumni that make it possible for us to keep Catholic high school tuition affordable, and, a few years ago, we instituted a "tuition cap" of \$10,000 so that no matter how many students a family has in our school, they will be able to send them to St. Mary's. And on that note, we are making progress on our annual Alumni Appeal. Our goal is \$175,000 (by June 30) and we are at \$121,365 as of writing this article. Thanks to everyone who so generously gives to support the good work that is going on here, and gives us a chance to "pay it forward" for those who invested in our own Catholic school education!


