RICHARD SCHULZE FAMILY FOUNDATION OFFERS \$25,000 CHALLENGE MATCHING GRANT

An amazing \$750,000 opportunity has been presented to Catholic schools across the Diocese of New Ulm! Richard Schulze, founder and chairman emeritus of Best Buy Co., Inc., and his foundation, the Schulze Family Foundation, has offered the Diocese of New Ulm a "Challenge Matching Grant" to assist our 13 elementary Catholic schools in enhancing educational excellence as well as growing enrollment. St. Mary's Catholic School is excited to report that we have been offered a \$25,000 matching grant from the Schulze Family Foundation.

HERE'S HOW IT WORKS

Each Catholic elementary school in the diocese is challenged to raise \$25,000. Schools that meet this Challenge would, in return, receive from the Schulze Family Foundation \$25,000, which totals \$50,000 back to the school.

MATCHING GRANT GUIDELINES

Donors to the Challenge Matching Grant must be: A "new donor" (one who has not financially supported a Catholic school in the diocese)

OR

A previous donor whose donation "exceeds" their largest previous donation to a Catholic school.

DEADLINE

The goal deadline for our school to raise \$25,000 is December 31, 2021. All donations must be collected by this date to meet the requirements for the match.

HOW WILL WE USE THE MONEY?

This grant will be used to expand our learning program by providing resources and opportunities for students who wish to learn beyond the expected curriculum. Classes offered would consist of (but not limited to) the following: Languages, pottery, stained glass window making, carpentry, home economics, robotics, solar and wind energy, astronomy, animals and wildlife. Some of these classes may be taught by community members skilled in these trades. As part of this expanded learning program, we also envision an outdoor classroom to enhance the learning experience. We believe this enrichment program can reach all students and inspire them to learn more about themselves, their interests, and the world around them.

We would also like this program to be an attraction and recruitment tool for others to join our school program. St. Mary's is blessed with a strong core curriculum that truly prepares our students for their futures. It is now our desire to provide opportunities for enrichment beyond the core curriculum. In this way, we hope to help all of our students discover an untapped interest, expand a current passion, or even plant the seed for a future career or lifelong hobby. We are so excited about offering this to our students and we want to truly amaze them with the opportunities that we will create, as well as show them what businesses and services are available within our community.

Solar Solutions.-Global and Local Impact

During the 2020-21 school year, St. Mary's Environmental Science class participated in a pilot program called "We Share Solar Solutionaries." This program provided an interdisciplinary blend of science and social studies lessons with the real world impact of deploying a solar suitcase to a refugee camp in Uganda. Through the lens of innovation and entrepreneurship, students were challenged to answer the driving question: How do we ensure access to electricity for nearly 1 billion people who lack it today while keeping the climate change below 1.5oC of warming?

The first phase of the We Share Solar Solutionaries program integrated two curriculums--science and social studies. In the science portion, students explored the solar energy industry and its impact on communities and on the environment. Next, they learned the basics of DC electricity by experimenting with solar cells, motors, and digital multimeters to maximize photovoltaic power. Assembling the solar suitcase culminated the science section. The solar suitcase is a 12-volt DC stand-alone solar power system that can power lights, cell phones and small electronic devices. Students took on roles as assembly engineers, quality control engineers, public relations specialists, and artists to prepare the suitcase for deployment to the Rwamwanja settlement in Uganda.

Through the social studies curriculum, students dove deeply into the concept of solidarity--the global dimension of loving one's neighbor (paraphrased from the Seven Themes of Catholic Social Teaching). Initial lessons focused on areas of the world that lack energy access and how that deficit impacts their opportunities in life. Then students grappled with the guestion. "How does the international community collaborate to set goals that will improve the lives of all people and the environment?" and evaluated the Sustainable Development Goals established by the United Nations in 2015. To create a more personal connection to the community that will benefit from the solar suitcase, students learned about hardships faced by refugees all over the world, and specifically about life in the Rwamwania refugee settlement. The final lesson challenged students to think as social entrepreneurs, to innovate solutions to problems such as lack of access to education or energy or clean water.

The second phase of the We Share Solar Solutionaries program was called "Knowledge to Action." Students used the skills they learned as solutionaries to identify an issue and then design an impactful solution using solar electric technology. Unanimously, they chose to solve the problem of no hot water in St. Mary's high school bathrooms. Partners researched the energy requirements and cost of different sized hot water heaters. Tim Zinniel ('88), president of Zinniel Electric, was

contacted to learn how to best incorporate solar energy. Through a series of meetings, the students and Mr. Zinniel decided to install nine 375 watt PV panels on the roof of the concession stand between the high school building and the football field and to use "the grid" as a battery. In other words, the energy produced by the PV panels will supply the school with a small portion of its electricity needs, thus saving on energy bills. Mr. Zinniel generously offered to donate all the supplies plus his time to make the project a reality. On Saturday, May 8, the six environmental science



students, along with Tim and AJ Klein, assembled, mounted, and hooked up the panels. As licensed electricians, Tim and AJ did all the wiring. Tim also donated five-year access to a web-based app which tracks overall energy and per-panel energy production data.

Another service benefit branching from the We Share Solar Solutionaries program is a partnership with St. Mary's chapter of MN Honor Society and Julie Neubauer, a former St. Mary's social studies teacher. The goal is to raise funds to purchase a second solar suitcase to send to the Maasai women in Noonkotiak, Kenya. (At this time, although enough money was collected, the actual deployment of the suitcase to Noonkotiak is on hold because of difficulties coordinating an installation team to be on site when Mrs. Neubauer travels to Kenya in September.)

St. Mary's involvement in this pilot program was made possible through MN Independent Schools Forum (MISF) STEM Community Partnership with We Share Solar. There was no cost for schools to participate in this first year grant-funded program. Teachers received training, curriculum, Solar Suitcase equipment, learning tools, and deployment of a Solar Suitcase to East Africa valued over \$2,500. In future years, schools can opt to participate and will be responsible for funding the cost to replace and deploy a Solar Suitcase kit.

Dear Alumni and Friends of St. Mary's School,



This year, we began the academic year in a much different place than last year, many of the "COVID" rules having become obsolete. The biggest victory of the last academic year is that we were in session the entire school year, and managed some absences of teachers and students, but we made it!

Most of our alumni of St. Mary's received a letter in the mail from a student requesting a pledge for our annual "Marathon for Public Education." (If you didn't, let me know and I will be happy to send you one!) I have always appreciated this annual letter writing campaign that the students do to our alumni, beyond the fact that it raises money for the school, it is a way for us to keep in touch with you all in a very personal way. Beyond your generosity that "pays it forward" each year, many students receive anything from a little note to a long letter from alumni who have fond memories of themselves being students at St. Mary's. The students like to receive these messages and notes that you include with the pledges that you send in!

The big project in front of us this next year is a new elevator for the school. Technically speaking, it is not an "elevator" but a lift that is classified as a LULA which is an abbreviation for Light Utility, Limited Access. It is smaller than a full-sized elevator, but is used often to move equipment, cleaning supplies, and

most importantly students and staff with injuries that prevent stairs. The current one that we have, installed 25 years ago, is still limping along, but we have been told that it is so obsolete that parts are impossible to get, so right now we are just "living on borrowed time" with it, as the phrase goes... Because it is not as complex as a full-sized elevator, the cost is more economical, we are figuring that \$150,000 will be needed to replace it. I mention this with the hope that this need might touch some hearts to generosity in helping us get this replaced.

This year, once again we are blessed to have some religious sisters teaching in the High School. Two of the Handmaids of the Heart of Jesus, a newly formed religious community, teach junior and senior religion. We are grateful not only for their teaching, but their presence as consecrated religious in our school, carrying on the long tradition of the religious sisters who have taught so many years, and who have been and continue to be a "sign of the Kingdom to come."

Lastly, I want to thank everyone for their continued support of St. Mary's School and its mission, most especially your continued prayers. Over and over again, I hear people from outside of the parish comment at how amazing it is that we are able to have what we do in our preK-12 Catholic School program in Sleepy Eye. And I share their wonderment! Please know that each school Mass ends with a prayer for our alumni and our benefactors. May the Lord continue to reward you all!
