

#### THE GIFT OF A TEACHER'S LOVE FOR ST. MARY'S

St. Mary's was blessed to be the beneficiary of a large gift of \$68,205.74 from Mrs. Helen Fohl in October 2020. Needless to say, we were grateful, excited and astounded, and yet quite puzzled; who is Mrs. Helen Fohl? Her obituary provided a small glimpse of who this generous woman was as it read: "She taught at schools in Morgan, Gilfillan, Sleepy Eye, Evan, and New Ulm, Minnesota, as well as in Seattle, Washington and Beaverton, Oregon," and other information indicating she taught here prior to 1955.

The question lingered about a week after a few phone calls were made to some folks in hopes they could shed some light. The mystery was over after Mary Carroll ('74) read the bulletin and learned our exciting news. We are grateful to Mary for providing the following information for us.

Mary's parents, Paul and Darleen (Appel '48) Carroll were dear friends Helen Fohl and Darleen Carroll together with Mick and Helen Fohl, who all lived above Al's Bakery on Main Street after Mass at St. Mary's Catholic Church. in 1948. Carrolls occupied the back apartment while Fohls lived in the front (Photo taken about five years ago by Nan- apartment. Helen was an elementary classroom teacher at St. Mary's despite few lay teachers then in both elementary and high school. Mick was a

telecommunications engineer and worked at the Sleepy Eye Telephone Company. By 1955 they had moved to Oregon when Mick got a job offer to work for General Telephone Corporation to improve telephone service and telephone lines in the Northwestern area of the country.

After Mick and Helen moved to Oregon, they maintained their close friendship with the Carrolls making trips to visit one another. Mick and Helen didn't have their own biological children but, as a teacher, Helen had a multitude of children she loved and educated.

Mary adds, "Helen was a grand lady who captivated everyone who knew her. Her life was exemplified by strength, compassion, sympathy, trust, patience, humor, acceptance, and generosity. Helen was probably Mom's oldest and dearest friend for more than 70 years. Helen wasn't Catholic but she loved Mom and she loved St. Mary's."

Since I arrived here at St. Mary's just eight months ago, I have come to be aware of and am so impressed with the group of very generous benefactors who support St. Mary's School. We have many alumni who, although they have not lived in Sleepy Eye since graduation from high school, continue to

support our programs and annual fundraisers and appeals. (One thing that I am particularly impressed with is each year at the time of the Marathon, our students send letters to our alumni and many send notes or memories of their time at St. Mary's School along with a contribution to the Marathon!)

In addition to our alumni, I have also discovered there are those who live "far and wide" and support our school simply because they want to contribute to what we provide here after hearing about it, or meeting one of our alumni. Recently, a priest in a different parish who has a number of St. Mary's alumni in his congregation made the comment that his "best parishioners are St. Mary's graduates!" This is a great testimony to the programs that we offer.

For all of us who have had the blessing of a Catholic School education, we have those to thank for their support. Those who "invested in us" with their financial support, time and talent and those who gave their whole life dedicated to teaching, the religious Sisters. Everything we invest in Catholic education is our way of "paying it forward" in gratitude for what we have received!

And I want everyone to know that we pray for our

alumni and benefactors, living and deceased, at our school Masses.

I would like to take this opportunity to tell you about our plans for the next big project at St. Mary's. Part of the "St. Mary's experience" is the beautiful church that we have, which in so many ways is the "crown jewel" of the Diocese of New Ulm and southwest Minnesota, a monument of our faith "on the prairie." Parishioners have been hearing about a big project we are anticipating in 2022, which is a new floor for the church and to restore/re-lead the remaining stained glass windows in the church that have not already been repaired. The cost of these two projects put together is going to be about \$650,000.00, and we are beginning to solicit donations.

The wooden floor, which was refinished in 2000 has reached the end of its life, and there is no further way to refinish or rehabilitate it. What is being proposed is a terrazzo floor. Terrazzo is in many churches (and St. Mary's School). It is a composite floor made of chips of stone held together in a poured composite that can be colored and designed. The benefit of such a replacement is that it is easy to clean and maintain and is basically a "100-year" floor. Since St. Mary's High School was built 60 years ago, the terrazzo floor there continues to serve us well, and since then the technology has so improved that it is more durable and requires less structural support, which makes it a good solution for the church.

Mentioning this, it is my hope that our alumni and benefactors may consider a gift to the cost of this project, helping us to keep St. Mary's the beautiful and impressive church that it is!
