"Well done, good and faithful servant" (Matthew 25:23). Few words are a more apt description of **Sr. Nicholine Mertz**. As she celebrated her 75th anniversary as a Franciscan Sister on August 11,

2016, Sr. Nicholine ('40) truly demonstrates how to live out the call to be a "good and faithful servant." Sr. Nicholine entered the Rochester Franciscan Congregation from St. Mary's Parish in Sleepy Eye, professing her first vows in 1941. She earned a Bachelor of Science in Elementary Education from the College of St. Teresa in Winona and a Master of Arts in Teaching (with a focus on religious education) from St. Mary's University in Wi-A natural teacher and nona. leader, she served as an educator

and/or religious education coordinator in parishes in Iona, Austin, Owatonna, Waseca, Chicago, Hayfield, Edina, Chatfield and Leavenworth.

Sr. Nicholine also spent twenty-two years at her home parish of St. Mary's in Sleepy Eye, both teaching and acting as the religious education chairperson. During that time, she worked with then-high school principal Jerry Neubauer. Neubauer shares: "In the fifteen years that Sister and I worked together at St. Mary's, I never thought of her as one of my staff for she became much more than that to me. She was my confident, my friend, my spiritual mentor, my sidekick. I would love to share with you a fault of Sister's, for she would get a kick out of that, but the only thing I can think of is the fact that she ate way too much and I always joked that this skinny

little woman would gain weight! A very special time in my early years with Sister was that, once a week, Sister would meet with the males on staff, Pat Gardon, Dave Freitag, Tim Solinger and me for faith formation. I always appreciated her in-

sights, her humor and the fact that she shared so much of herself with us, especially with me. I always felt that I may not have been the smartest administrator who lived, but I knew that I had the most blessings in my life and Sr. Nicholine was truly one of them."

So many, many people have been blessed because Sr. Nicholine said "Yes!" to her vocation as is evidenced by the comments on the Facebook posts congratulating her on this anniversary including: Such a

remarkable woman!; Love this lady!; She is an awesome lady! Love her sense of humor!; Love, love, love Sr. Nicholine!; One of the most incredible women I know and I am one of the blessed ones! Thank YOU!. Her remarkable life was acknowledged as she was inducted into the St. Mary's Hall of Fame for Distinguished Service Achievement in 2008.

Sr. Nicholine is currently retired and lives at Assisi Heights in Rochester. Through her years of service to God and His Church, she has taught us all so much about what it truly means to love God and others, to act with generous selflessness and to live a life of joy in doing God's will. Congratulations Sr. Nicholine on your 75th anniversary as a Franciscan Sister and on your life as a continued "good and faithful servant!"



#### ST. MARY'S REPRESENTED AT WYD 2016

Kennedy Pelzel ('15) along with Sarah Jirak, religion teacher and Msgr. Lozinski, pastor at St. Mary's, joined 12 others from the New Ulm Diocese in July for World Youth Day in Poland with Pope Francis. Close to three million people were in attendance so imagine their surprise when they crossed paths with Santi Sanchez, the exchange student from Spain who attended St. Mary's last year. In addition to attending the WYD events, the group toured historical and religious sites including Saint Pope John Paul II's birthplace, home and museum. WYD was a real example of the universality of the Church throughout the world as well as a model of young people actively living their faith.



#### THE HEART OF THE SCHOOL

Just as the kitchen is often referred to as the "heart of the home," the kitchen at St. Mary's can be considered the "heart of the school." From the nutritious and delicious school lunches prepared and served there

on a daily basis, to the many brunches and bake sales which support the parish and various charities to the pre-game dinners and awards banquets for sports to the volunteers peeling apples and potatoes to the generosity of the Catering Ladies' meal preparations, the list of the uses of the kitchen and cafeteria is nearly endless. However, the dedicated kitchen staff has had to work with outdated equipment, making their jobs more difficult than necessary. Thus, St. Mary's is proud to announce our plans to remodel the school kitchen. With assistance from **Bob Broich** ('71), the current kitchen situation was assessed and a remodeling plan was developed in two phases, giving the highest priority to safety issues. During phase 1, we replaced the ventilation system above the ovens and installed a fire suppression system at a cost of approximately \$50,000. Phase 2, tentatively scheduled for the first day of summer break in 2017, includes plans to remove asbestos, replace the HVAC system, redo some of the floor plumbing, replace the walk-in cooler box (the evaporator and condenser were replaced in May of 2016), put down new floor tile (either ceramic or porcelain), install a new dishwasher system, replace the suspended ceiling grid and tile, install tile and stainless steel on the walls, replace the cabinets and do all necessary electrical and plumbing work. The total estimate of this phase of the remodeling project is approximately \$120,000 with the project contingent on funding. The kitchen and cafeteria will not be accessible during the entire remodel. This remodel will be a tremendous benefit to our kitchen staff, our students and staff and all who utilize the kitchen.
