They knew that Marie was the head cook at school and that she did some catering, but they were unaware of how much she donates. They did not realize that she gives all the proceeds to the parish and school which ends up being about \$25,000.00 each year. We spoke as well of the Nex-Tu-Nu II store uptown and how it generates \$40,000.00 for our parish and school. These are possible because of the kindness of so many people who give of their time, treasure and talent. I tried to impress upon them what a good thing we have here at St. Mary's due to the sacrifices of so many good people and their love of Christ and His Holy Church. This is a conversation we need to have not only with our students but with all connected to St. Mary's.

I am so appreciative of all who give of their time, talent and treasure. Due to such generosity, we have something almost unparalleled in this area. I thank each of you, our alumni and friends of St. Mary's for your continued support. It is all worth it and if you can sacrifice even a little more, we surely would appreciate it and put it to good use.
